## PRO PATRIA.

Thomas H. Hudson came to College from Motueka in 1909 and was with us for two years. He entered the Government Service (Lands Department) and was stationed at New Plymouth when he enlisted. He offered his services immediately war broke out, joining the Taranaki Company of the Wellington Infantry, and was at once attached to the Headquarters Signallers as a Corporal. He helped to repel the first attack on the Suez Canal, and was in the first landing at Gallipoli. Although he had his share of marvellous escapes on the Peninsula he went through the campaign without a wound. Sickness, however, overcame him and he was invalided to England in September of last year, suffering from enteric. He was discharged from hospital and went to the New Zealand Base Depot, Hornchurch, in January, 1916. His constitution, however, had evidently been undermined, for he contracted pneumonia and died in the Walton-on-Thames Military Hospital on May 18th, 1916. Tom. Hudson's many friends will be glad to learn that Lawrence Chaytor was present at his funeral, and sent a wreath as a tribute from Old Nelson Collegians.
