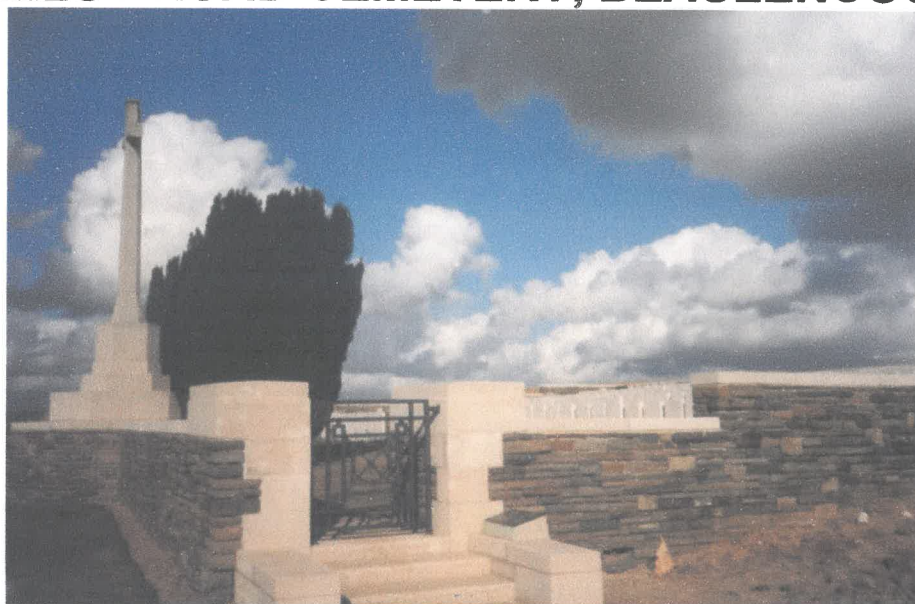

WILL OF WILLIAM MCGREGOR

Commission Agent, at present serving as Rifleman No 55610 in the NZ Rifle Brigade hereby revoke all former testamentary instruments made by me and declare this to be my last will which I make on 20th October 1917.

I bequeath my brother George McGregor my gold chain and silver cup and wearing apparel.

I bequeath the following pecuniary legacies free of death duties and to be preferentially payable in the order named.

Mary McGregor, c/- C Walton, 127 Austral Rd, Kalgoorlie, Western Australia, one hundred and fifty pounds.

To my brother George McGregor of Waverley House, Boulder Rd, Kalgoorlie, twenty pounds.

To my sister Blanche McGregor, c/- Mr Cyril Mahoney, Remuera Rd, Auckland, twenty pounds.

I bequeath to Mr Frank Curran of Nelson, the free use for the period of one year after my death of my trotting sulky and all my trotting harness and saddlery which shall after such a period be sold.

My trustee shall hold the residue of the said money after funeral expenses etc, called the trust fund, upon trust for my niece Beatrice McGregor and my nephew George McGregor (children of my brother George) in equal shares if they attain 21 years of age. If they should die, then I bequeath to my brother George and sister Blanche in equal shares. If they should all die before the said times, then I bequeath the trust fund to the said Frank Curran for his absolute use and benefit.

Signed by William McGregor as his last will and testament in the presence of witnesses.
